## TOURNAMENT FACT SHEET

### Quick Facts

- 144-player field in a 54-hole stroke play tournament
- 13 states, Canada, Mexico and Thailand represented
- 26 players from the home state of Arizona
- 24 players have signed National Letters of Intent
- 18 Rolex Junior All-Americans

### Tournament Storylines

- ***Historic Perspective – Beyond the AJGA***  
Of the 24 past champions, 22 earned Rolex Junior All-America accolades in the same year. Hunter Mahan (1999) and Paula Creamer (2003) were named Rolex Junior Player of the Year following wins at the Winn Grips Heather Farr Classic hosted by Longbow Golf Club. Both have gone on to have successful professional careers alongside Amanda Blumenherst (2002) and In-Bee Park (2005).
- ***AJGA's 2010 Tournament of the Year***  
The Winn Grips Heather Farr Classic hosted by Longbow Golf Club was named the AJGA's Tournament of the Year in 2010 for showcasing the AJGA, its members, sponsors and host facility better than any other event on the Association's schedule. In a tournament that provides top-notch competition over the traditional Easter weekend, committee members combined heavy media exposure, accommodating facilities and outstanding customer service to participants who traveled to Longbow Golf Club.

- ***Past Champions Return***

Three players who have captured titles at Longbow Golf Club will return in 2011. Locals *Trey Kaahanui* (Tempe, Ariz.) and *Kyung Kim* (Chandler, Ariz.), won the event together in 2008 and have competed in the tournament each year since the victory. Kaahanui and Kim won side by side again in 2010 at the PING Phoenix Junior, which took place at Moon Valley Country Club. Last year's Girls Division champion, *Alison Lee* (Valencia, Calif.) will return to defend the title after a 5-under-par 211 performance in 2010.

- ***In Honor of Heather Farr***

Heather Farr was an Arizona native who saw the first days of the AJGA. She was victorious at the second-annual Polo Golf Junior Classic in 1979 and the 1982 Rolex Tournament of Champions. To recognize Farr's accomplishments on the course, she earned Rolex Junior Player of the Year honors in 1980 and 1982 and was named a Rolex Junior All-American five times.

A two-time All-American and three-time All-Conference performer at Arizona State University, Farr qualified for the LPGA Tour in October 1985 at the age of 20, becoming the youngest to do so at the time.

In 1989, she was diagnosed with breast cancer at the age of 24. Farr was practicing for a comeback on Tour in the fall of 1990 when she discovered a reoccurrence of cancer in the back of her skull and on her vertebrae. Heather lost her battle on November 20, 1993.

## **Top Players to Watch**

- Alison Lee, Valencia, Calif.***  
Lee is back to defend her 2010 title. Coming off a tie for third at February's ANNIKA Invitational, Lee is ranked No. 8 in the Polo Golf Rankings. This will be her third year competing at the Winn Grips Heather Farr Classic hosted by Longbow Golf Club.
- Lindsey Weaver, Scottsdale, Ariz.***  
Weaver is competing at Longbow Golf Club for the fourth consecutive year after finishing four strokes behind Lee for third-place honors in 2010. Weaver has placed inside the top 10 each time she has competed at Longbow Golf Club. She has won an AJGA event each year since 2006 and looks for her first of 2011.
- Beau Hossler, Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif.***  
Hossler is the highest-ranked boy in the field at No. 15 in the Polo Golf Rankings. Hossler, a high school sophomore, had a breakout year in 2010, winning the Stockton Sports Commission Junior Open and the Trader Joe's Junior Championship hosted by Pat Hurst en route to first-team Rolex Junior All-America accolades. This will be his second appearance at the AJGA's annual Easter event in Arizona.
- Zachary Wright, Phoenix, Ariz.***  
Wright was an honorable mention Rolex Junior All-America selection last year and comes into the event No. 22 in the Polo Golf Rankings. Wright has yet to capture his first title but has compiled eight top-10 AJGA finishes, including at tie for seventh at this year's HP Boys Championship hosted by Carlton Woods.
